

The Covid-19 Pandemic and Data Sharing for the Public Good: Attitudinal, Ethical, and Legal Approaches to Privacy During the Pandemic and Beyond

Does the Covid-19 pandemic lead to a temporary or persistent shift in the acceptance of data sharing practices for public benefit purposes? The project measures the acceptance of different data sharing scenarios at multiple time points to show which situational parameters affect acceptance, and whether these parameters change over time. This research adds to our understanding of the context dependency of privacy attitudes. By involving ethical and legal sciences it will help translate the research results into guidelines for policy-makers and legislators when processing personal data for the public good.
